



The <u>Dan Scott Ranch Management Program</u> has teamed up with local ranch groups to train the next generation of ranch workers with the **Montana Ranch Boot Camp**, which will kick off this summer. Taught by ranchers, its vision is to provide students with an immersive, hands-on experience that equips them with ranch and rural skills before they enter more advanced training. This experience will set them up for success and prepare the future workforce of our rural communities.

Students from multiple programs will learn from ranchers, land stewards, consultants, mechanics and community members. Skills taught will include cattle handling, how to talk to ranchers, first aid, grazing decisions, vehicle maintenance and much more.

"We are taking the first step to bridge the gap between a young and eager, but inexperienced workforce, and the ranching industry that needs to recruit new employees," said Rachel Frost, DSRMP program lead.

The camp will alternate being hosted by the Winnett ACES and the Ranchers Stewardship Alliance, both rancher-led groups that focus on strengthening local communities through land stewardship and economic opportunity. The Boot Camp will serve students in the DSRMP, the MT DNRC Working Lands Internship Program and the Quivira Coalition's New Agrarian Program.
